I started modelling when, at seven years old, I built the Keil-kraft rubber powered series of models. Some plastic Airfix kits were built but they never gave the excitement of seeing a model fly for the first time.

An interest in model boating over the last few years has led me to model hovercraft. having tried this type many years ago without a lot of success. As with my aircraft modelling it is the unusual that catches my eye hence my interest has been in submarines and fast electric units. The hovercraft has been the most challenging in that there is so much to research and electric power provides an even bigger challenge.
